ST. CROIX, USVI – The Virgin Islands Department of Education invites the public to the 46<sup>th</sup> Annual Territorial Spelling Bee and State MATHCOUNTS Competition. Both events will be held in St. Croix.

The **Spelling Bee** will be held on **Tuesday, March 19, 2019**, in the **John H. Woodson Jr. High School auditorium** at **10 a.m.**

The territory's top 12 spellers will compete for the championship title and the opportunity to represent the Virgin Islands at the 92<sup>nd</sup> Scripps National Spelling Bee on May 28–30, 2019, in Maryland.

The **State MATHCOUNTS Competition** will be held on **Thursday, March 21, 2019**, in the **University of the Virgin Islands Great Hall** at **10 a.m.**

A total of 20 Mathletes from five schools across the St. Croix and St. Thomas - St. John districts will compete to represent the territory in 2019 Raytheon MATHCOUNTS National Competition on May 12-13, 2019, in Orlando, Florida.

Schools represented are Antilles School, Bertha C. Boschulte Middle School, Good Hope Country Day, Church of God of Holiness Academy and John H. Woodson Jr. High School.

**MATHCOUNTS** is a national program designed to improve math skills among U.S. students. The program focuses on middle school students, who are at a crucial stage in developing and sustaining math interest and ability. Students who do not begin developing strong problem-solving, logical thinking and analytical abilities in middle school will face an uphill battle later in life if they wish to pursue a medical, scientific, mathematical, engineering or technical career.
